



Governor's Success Initiative

Utah Correctional Industries (UCI) is a self funded division of the Utah Department of Corrections. Like all state agencies, UCI was tasked by Governor Gary Herbert to increase efficiencies by 25% by 2016.

UCI was approached by the Governor's Office of Management and Budget about utilizing the Theory of Constraints (TOC) to increase efficiencies and meet UCI's goal of reducing recidivism. UCI was introduced to Bahadir Inozu, Ph.D., Principal and Co-Founder of NOVACES, LLC.

Baha and his team worked with UCI and implemented the following TOC tools: Value Stream Analysis, Capacity Planning in the UCI Furniture Shop, Simplified Drum Buffer Rope in the UCI Print Shop, and Critical Chain Project Management for the UCI Construction group.

The results have been astounding since implementation of these TOC tools. These are a few of the results:

Furniture Shop:

- *Created a stabilized flow that resulted in:*
 - *Gained ability to track the production status of each piece of furniture.*
 - *Reliable completion dates are now available for the customer.*
 - *Furniture production capacity has doubled.*
 - *Revenue increased by 19% over the previous year.*
 - *A production baseline has been established that can be continuously improved .*
- *And, most importantly, the increased capacity has allowed the hiring of almost 40% more inmates; more skilled inmates with proper training = less recidivism which equals meeting the Governor's Success Initiative.*

Print Shop:

- *The Print Shop is able to track jobs in real-time, and forecast the capacity and the load accurately.*
- *There has been a 32% increase in jobs handled, 30% increase in sales revenue, and lead times have been shortened by 12%.*
- *Revenue increased by \$323,633 in FY15 as a result.*

Construction:

- *On the first major project using CCPM, UCI was able to overcome all obstacles (including weather delays) and complete an "impossible" schedule on time.*
- *Staff and inmate workers are excited about the prospects.*
- *"We can now guarantee on-time completion."*

In addition to the TOC tools, UCI has been working over the past three years to achieve ISO 9001 certification. We are pleased to report that six of UCI's cost centers have received ISO 9001 certification! This is a monumental achievement that has been accomplished under the direction of UCI Deputy Director Bryan Morris, along with countless hours of work by staff and offenders alike.

TOC and ISO 9001 have done wonders for the efficiency and productivity of UCI, and truly enhanced the ability to provide quality work opportunities for offenders.

The State Use Law

63-56-423 Purchase of prison industry goods.

- (1) All public procurement units shall purchase goods and services produced by the Utah Correctional Industries Division as provided by this section, which is an exemption from this chapter. All political subdivisions of the state may purchase these goods and services and are encouraged to do so when feasible.*
- (2) By July 1 of each year, the director of the Utah Correctional Industries shall publish and distribute to all state agencies and interested political subdivisions a catalog of goods and services provided by the Correctional Industries Division. The catalog shall include a description and price of each item offered for sale. The catalog shall be updated and revised during the year as the director deems necessary.*
- (3) State departments, agencies, and institutions may not purchase any goods or services provided by the Correctional Industries Division from any other source unless it has been determined in writing by the director of Correctional Industries and the state procurement officer or in the case of institutions of higher education, the institutional procurement officer, that purchase from the Correctional Industries Division is not feasible due to one of the following circumstances:
 - (a) the good or service offered by the division does not meet the reasonable requirements of the purchasing agency;*
 - (b) the good or service can not be supplied within a reasonable time by the division; or*
 - (c) the cost of the good or service, including basic price, transportation costs, and other expense of acquisition, is not competitive with the cost of procuring the item from another source. In case of disagreement, the decision may be appealed to a board consisting of the director of the Department of Corrections, the director of Administrative Services, and a neutral third party agreed upon by the other two members or, in case of institutions of higher education, the president of the involved institution shall make the final decision.**

Traditional Industries Programs

Our traditional industries work programs provide cost-effective, quality goods and services to state agencies, counties, cities, other government municipalities, and numerous private sector partners. Each year these manufacturing and service operations save Utah taxpayers hundreds of thousands of dollars while providing meaningful work experience to inmate workers.

Private Sector Partnerships

A number of our (PS) Private Sector / (PIE) Prison Industries Enhancement programs are showcased in this catalog. PS/PIE

(Private Sector/Prison Industries Enhancement)

The PIE Certification Program was created by Congress in 1979 to encourage states and units of local government to establish employment opportunities for prisoners that emulate private-sector work opportunities. The program is designed to place inmates in a realistic work environment, pay them the prevailing local wage for similar work, and enable them to acquire marketable skills to increase their potential for successful rehabilitation and meaningful employment upon release. A total of 50 jurisdictions may be certified under the PIE Certification Program. To become certified, each program must demonstrate to the Director of the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA), U.S. Department of Justice, that it meets statutory and guideline requirements as listed under Mandatory Criteria for Program Participation. The statute and guidelines are designed to create a level playing field with the private sector. UCI has been PIE certified since 1985.

The PIE Certification Program has two primary objectives:

1. Generate products and services that enable prisoners to make a contribution to society, help offset the cost of their incarceration, compensate crime victims, and support their families.
2. Reduce prison idleness, increase inmate job skills, and improve the prospects for successful inmate transition to the community on release.

Eligible jurisdictions that apply to participate in the PIE Certification Program must meet all nine of the following criteria:

1. Legislative authority to involve the private sector in the production and sale of prison-made goods, and administrative authority to ensure that mandatory program criteria will be met through internal policies and procedures.
2. Legislative authority to pay wages at a rate not less than that paid for similar work in the same locality's private sector.
3. Written assurances that the PIE Certification Program will not result in the displacement of workers employed before program implementation.
4. Authority to provide worker benefits, including workers' compensation or its equivalent.
5. Legislative or administrative authority to take deductions not to exceed 80 percent of gross wages for room and board; taxes (federal, state, local); allocations for support of family pursuant to state statute, court order, or agreement by offender; and contributions of not more than 20 percent, but not less than 5 percent of gross wages to any fund established by law to compensate the victims of crime.
6. Written assurances that inmate participation is voluntary.
7. Written proof of consultation with related organized labor before PIE Certification Program startup.
8. Written proof of consultation with related local private industry before PIE Certification Program startup.
9. Compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act and related federal environmental review requirements.

Commissary Services



UCI Commissary, based at the Utah State Prison in Draper, is a centralized, canteen operation that processes approximately 3,600 orders per week.

UCI Commissary offers products for sale to the inmates that the prison system doesn't provide. Items sold on commissary include: various food items, writing materials, electronics, an assortment of hygiene products, arts & crafts items, and a number of approved pieces of clothing.

UCI Commissary employs female inmates who learn order fulfillment, inventory control, warehousing, forklift operation, and quality control. These and other job skills will help them obtain employment after their release from prison.

UCI Commissary provides products and services to the inmates housed at the Draper Prison Site and the Central Utah Correctional Facility (CUCF) in Gunnison.

The staff and female inmates at UCI commissary work as a team to provide excellent customer service and a professional working atmosphere!



Document Scanning


UCI Scanning can scan virtually any type/size document - from slides, microfilm, & microfiche to large maps and more! We can scan black & white, grey-scale, or color; and we can do so in a number of formats (.pdf, .tiff, .jpeg, etc). We can also scan your documents using OCR (Optimized Character Recognition) which allows you to search the body of the scanned document for specific text.

Taking all of your old documents and converting them to digital files will help your office look like an office again (instead of a warehouse).

UCI Scanning also has a history of providing Data Entry services. Attaching metadata (or indexing) affords convenient and easy document searchability and has proven to be a very helpful component of completed customer files/projects. We match or exceed the keystroke speeds found in the private sector and our process of entering and verifying all data results in an error rate that is well below the industry average.

Our Scanning shop also has the ability to help with your Micrographics needs. Whether you need to have your old Tax Assessment records put to film for Utah State Archives, or you simply want to reduce the amount of storage space you need for all those old boxes and filing cabinets full of dusty documents - We Can Help! Most importantly, if your physical or digital files ever get lost, damaged, or destroyed - they can easily be re-scanned from rolls of microfilm!




License Plates



Textiles/Sewing








UCI Textile customers have come to expect (and receive) quality products and services. The UCI Sewing shop has carefully selected workers who have an eye for detail.


Asbestos Abatement

The UCI Asbestos Abatement department began operating in September of 1987. We all know that asbestos is no longer used in the construction of new buildings. However, a number of structures throughout the state are older and still contain this dangerous substance. That is why this program was started and why it is still such a valuable asset for the state.

Aside from the obvious health benefits afforded by this service, the Asbestos Abatement program provides substantial savings to taxpayers. The State saves from 20% to 50% on normal direct removal costs when UCI Asbestos Abatement crews are utilized.

Inmates and staff who participate in this program receive intensive, certified asbestos removal training. This certification not only ensures that we provide the best asbestos removal services possible, but also helps many inmates obtain employment after their release from prison.

Asphalt Crackseal



The Asphalt Crack Seal Program began in 1997 with contracts from the Division of Facilities and Construction Management (DFCM) and the Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT).



The Asphalt Crack Seal crew consists of a supervisor and 5 to 6 inmates. They have a self-contained vehicle that includes a tar pot, air compressor, various tools and equipment, and enough material for a full day of continuous crack sealing.



The crew performs repairs on roads and streets as well as parking lots and pathways. UCI Asphalt Crackseal has worked in many of the state parks throughout Utah, including areas as far away as Kanab and Escalante.



Beverage Processing

For over 40 years UCI Beverage Processing has processed, packaged, and distributed all of the milk and juice for the Department of Corrections, the Division of Institutional Operations (the prison).

Today, the dairy herds are gone and UCI purchases 1/2-pint cartons of milk in bulk. Milk was formerly distributed twice a day (with breakfast and dinner), but is now served only once a day (at breakfast).

However, UCI has developed 2 types of assorted sugar-free juices that are processed in-house and packaged in plastic containers that are tamper evident and help reduce waste.

“Juice One” is a standard, sugar-free juice that typically accompanies the inmate lunches. “Juice Two” is a recent addition to our production and is a vitamin enriched, sugar-free juice that accompanies the inmate dinners.

Construction



The UCI Construction operation was established in 1989 to facilitate construction and remodeling of UCI buildings at the Draper Prison site. In 1997, the program began contracting with the Division of Facilities and Construction Management (DFCM) to work on other state owned buildings and properties.

UCI Construction employs experienced construction supervisors well versed in government regulations and the latest building codes. Being managed by these individuals ensures that our inmate construction teams will meet your expectations as well as the needs of your project.

UCI is licensed by the Department of Occupational and Professional Licensing as a general contractor and is capable of working in most construction capacities. From simple remodels to complete building construction, we have the crew for you!



UCI started their Roofing program in conjunction with the Division of Facilities and Construction Management (DFCM) in 1997. The parameters for this program are similar to that of the UCI Construction operation concerning the types of jobs UCI can undertake.

Inmates in the Roofing Services Program can install all types of roofing systems including: asphalt shingles, shake shingles, metal panels, metal shakes, single-ply EPDM, and single-ply PVC. They are also trained to perform maintenance work on all types of government roofs.

UCI crews are trained by certified consultants and supervised by experienced and knowledgeable staff. This management and training is why each roof is backed with a no-leak guarantee!

Serving Time Café



Utah Correctional Industries' "Serving Time Café" is open to the public and is located on Prison Property (next to the UCI Showroom). The café's doors opened for business on December 7, 2009 with just three staff and five inmates.



The Café serves breakfast and lunch, with breakfast available all day. All of the food is prepared, baked, and grilled by female inmates. These inmates learn many of the skills necessary to successfully work in the fast paced environment of the restaurant industry. Inmates start out as dishwashers and dining room attendants and have the opportunity to work their way up to prep cooks, bakers, and grill cooks/line cooks.

The Café serves a wide variety of menu items from hamburgers to deli sandwiches, daily soups to specialty desserts, and bacon & eggs to breakfast burritos. Whatever your preference, you're sure to find something to satisfy your appetite.

Serving Time Café also offers catering services for your business luncheons, retirement parties, and conferences. You can choose from box lunches; deli, vegetable, and cheese platters; or a variety of entrees to meet your business luncheon needs.
